

Morocco Authority

Établissement Autonome de Contrôle et de Coordination des Exportations

- EACCE was established in 1986
 as an independent inspection
 authority, in order to guarantee
 all aspects of quality of the
 Moroccan fruit and vegetables
 export products.
- EACCE operates exclusively in the export sector and EACCE is solely responsible to the authorities of foreign markets for the quality of exported Moroccan products.



Human resources



The export inspectors are public servants of the EACCE. All inspectors have a degree or diploma related to food quality and the agro-food industry and receive one year's initial training.

The EACCE organise refreshing training programmes for the inspectors focused on quality assurance systems and changing regulations and standards.

Laboratory network

- The EACCE currently has six laboratories conducting physical, chemical and microbiological tests and checking packaging quality.
- These laboratories are located in Casablanca, Agadir, Berkane, Meknès, Larache and Marrakech. In order to harmonise its food inspection procedures within the organisation EACCE uses ISO 17025 accredited laboratories.



Commercial Office Network

 The inspection and monitoring of exports continues through to the country of destination, thanks to the EACCE's offices abroad.




Packing Station

- All exporting companies must have an EACCE approval.
- -If everything is found satisfactory, they become an official "Packing Station". The certification must be renewed every year.
- -The EACCE may also recognise the companies' self control after an audit, which may lead to a reduction in routine inspection



Standard applied



FFV are subject to technical inspection prior to shipping. The product must be conformed to the standards and regulations of the importing country.

Fruits and vegetables export lots must comply with international standards. EACCE applies the 10 specific EU standards.

If the exported fresh fruit and vegetables are not covered by the 10 specific EU standards, the EACCE applies the OECD/ UNECE standards in order to maintain the best quality for export.

Auto Control systems in companies

- •Exporter companies shows a high level of quality in all steps of the selection and packing process. They use good auto control quality systems that ensure the traceability of their products.
- Each "Packing Station" is assigned to one inspector who must attend the company, if requiered, at any time.



Lots inspection

- The EACCE implements the export inspection according to the OECD inspection method which is compulsory in the members of the OECD Scheme.
- All export lots must be checked.
 The inspection is based on sampling and amples are taken from lots prepared at the packaging station,
- During inspection It's applied tolerances which are in force in the countries of destination



Conformity certificate



- Each lot is inspected and, if conform, the inspector signs the conformity certificate. Certificate is compulsory to export the goods.
- If FVV don't have EU specific marketing standards OECD-UNECE standards are applied.
- The certificate includes additional information "Lot conforme a la norme CEE/ONU"
