

**COLLEGIATE BOARD RESOLUTION No. 983 OF 28 JULY 2025**

Amends Collegiate Board Resolution – RDC No. 843 of 22 February 2024, which provides for the regularization of food and packaging under the jurisdiction of the Brazilian Health Surveillance System (SNVS, in Portuguese) intended for supply within Brazilian territory.

The Collegiate Board of Directors of the Brazilian Health Regulatory Agency, in the use of the attributions vested in it under Article 7, items III and IV, and Article 15, items III and IV of Law no. 9,782 of 26 January 1999, and Article 187, item VI, Paragraph 1 of the Internal Regulation approved by Collegiate Board Resolution – RDC no. 585 of 10 December 2021, adopts the following Collegiate Board Resolution, as decided upon in a meeting held on 28 July 2025, and I, Acting Director-President, determine its publication.

Article 1. Collegiate Board Resolution – RDC No. 843 of 22 February 2024, published in the Federal Official Gazette No. 40 of 28 February 2024, section 1, pages 109-111 shall come into effect with the following alterations:

"Article 31. ....

Paragraph 1. The products referred to in the caption of this article that are manufactured up to the date of publication of the final decision on the application for marketing authorization may be made available on the market until the end of their expiration dates.

Paragraph 2. The labels of the products referred to in the caption of this article may be used for up to 180 (one hundred and eighty) days from the date of publication of the favorable decision on the application for marketing authorization, exclusively for the purpose of depleting previously produced packaging materials.

Paragraph 3. The products manufactured with the labels referred to in Paragraph 2 of this article may not present any changes in composition or labeling. The only permitted occurrence is the absence of the statement: "Food granted marketing authorization by Anvisa," followed by the full marketing authorization number." (new writing)

" Article 32. ....

Paragraph 1. The products referred to in the caption of this article that are manufactured up to the date of notification may be made available on the market until the end of their expiration dates.

Paragraph 2. The labels of the products referred to in the caption of this article may be used for up to 180 (one hundred and eighty) days from the date of notification in Anvisa's electronic system, exclusively for the purpose of depleting previously produced packaging materials.

Paragraph 3. The products manufactured with the labels referred to in Paragraph 2 of this article must be regularized and may not present any changes in composition or labeling. The only permitted occurrence is the absence of the statement: "Food notified with Anvisa," followed by the notification process number. (new writing)

" Article 33. ....

Paragraph 6. The labels of the products referred to in the caption of this article may be used for up to 180 (one hundred and eighty) days, counting from the date of notification in Anvisa's electronic system, exclusively for the purpose of depleting previously produced packaging materials.

Paragraph 7. Products manufactured with the labels referred to in Paragraph 6 of this article must be regularized and may not present any changes in composition or labeling. The only permitted occurrence is the absence of the statement: "Food notified with Anvisa," followed by the notification process number. (new writing)

Article 2. This Resolution shall come into effect on the date of its publication.
