Dear Domingo

I received this morning
here your letter sent to Mame
in Paris & I hope ^{Julio} will take proper
care of himself by going out of
town for some time.

I notice by your letter you never
received the '3 Agendas' I sent you
from Paris. I put myself the 3
books inside the parcel & Mariette
tied it up & it was sent to Manchester
& I have enquired here I found it
out that the parcel went to Rio
by the Gamara that sailed
Southampton on the 14th January
& arrived about the 6th of February
in Rio Janeiro, the parcel was
addressed to George Home because

it also contained some shirt for
 Mrs George Heime, probably by
 mistake the books ^{have} either ^{and} with
 Alfred Heime in the store or with
 George Heime you can show this
 letter & ask ^{to} any of them about
 it. 2 of the books are Agendas from
 the Source & one from the Pinktops
 that the books went from here there
 is not the slightest doubt as I wrote
 to the house here about it, & to day
 they showed me the date it went to
 Rio. so it must be somewhere
 there, so try to find out where it is.
 I have been here for 7 days & I do
 not know how long I shall stop
 here, the weather here is always
 very bad, smoky, foggy, & rainy
 weather is what we have every
 day, yesterday it was very cold,
 there is fire in every room. I
 am in the Hotel, & it is a very
 nice one, good in many people
 when I sent the Parcel



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here, the food is excellent, the greater part of it is made French cooking. there ^{are} good many German, Spaniards & Russian living here now. Mama will have given you more news than I can give you; my work is to go ^{up} about 300/400 steps during the day to see goods, & see good many articles & sometimes can not get what I want at my prices I think it will be all the better for you, if Matthews only comes next year, because then every thing will be settled in Rio, whereas now every body is in suspense until the constituent will be formed to confirm the Republic &

all the government act; I know
that for myself it is on account
of change of government, a bad
year again, & have to wait again
for better times, as everything will
be giving loss on account of the
great fall of Exch. that spoils all
the calculations that were made
months ago. I have received
Meagallha's ^{letter} & will reply soon, in
the meantime, thank him for
the information he has sent
which is only for myself.
Remember me to Bellin & all
her family your father
