

Paris 3rd July 1890

Dear Domingos I wrote you a letter & Julio
on the 28th Ult as per enclosed duplicate, & hope you
have received it. This alteration of my voyage to the
12th Inst has put everything behind. I hope you &
Julio will do your best to make the affair all
right. If you have had to speak to Mr Ernest
Harper, you need not deliver the duplicate, as he has
had the original. Keep it until my arrival, as the dupli-
cate I only send in case of need.

I sent yesterday a telegram to Domingos, but ad-
dressed to James Weather. saying
"Lacombe part douze Juillet."

this morning I received a letter from Nelson, saying
that they received yesterday a telegram from Rio House
saying "Lacombe's son wants to know if sailed".
He asked me for a reply by wire, for him to inform
you, what you wanted. I said I had sent already
the above telegram, & he might confirm it.

I have been going with your mother to St. Germain regularly
were there yesterday I have to go again tomorrow
& very likely will continue so until the 10th Inst
on which day we shall leave Paris, to remain
one day in Bordeaux, & allow your mother to rest.
Good by my sons until the first of August, which
is the day the Torata has to arrive in Rio. I will
send you a telegram from Bahia. Take rooms
from the 1st of August. your father
