

Rio de Janeiro, 29th April 1919.

Dear Mr Lobenhoffer.

This letter is simply to expose to you my projects about my son Mario, who is at present in Philadelphia, completing his commercial course. I wish you to be frank with me and let me know whether you could admit him in your office for 6 or 7 months, without any salary, I would pay all his expenses.

My son was working here but he found that he had a good deal to learn yet and went to Philadelphia, United States, in January last, and has now advised me that about end of the year he would complete the course and I would like him to get in touch with the English business, and also with English families.

Do you think that you could let him work in your office and learn the English system of business? How much should I allow per month to live in London, a simple life without too much amusements etc.? On his return here ~~for~~ I will either keep him in Rio, or send him for sometime to Santos, I wish however for him to go over to France also, for a short time, if you can recommend him in some firm in Marseilles or Havre.

Mr David Sion told me he would talk to you about my son on his arrival in London. I hope this friend will soon be with you and settle all matters for future business.
