OUR BIODIVERSITY IS OUR WEALTH

BRAZIL IS A COUNTRY OF CONTINENTAL DIMENSIONS AND HOME TO INVALUABLE NATURAL WEALTH: ITS FORESTS, GRASSLANDS, AND OTHER FORMS OF NATIVE VEGETATION.

These ecosystems regulate the climate, sustain rivers, and shelter rich biodiversity, indigenous people, and other local communities. Conserving this heritage means protecting the future of humanity. During COP26 in Glasgow, Brazil made a historic commitment to halt and reverse forest loss and environmental degradation by 2030. The country updated its climate targets through its Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC): by 2035, it aims to reduce emissions by up to two-thirds, with deforestation control as the main strategy to achieve this goal.

Since 2004, Brazil has developed **ACTION PLANS FOR DEFORESTATION AND FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL**, starting with the Amazon, followed by the Cerrado, and extending to all Brazilian biomes in 2025 for the first time in history.

The Action Plans for Deforestation and Fire Prevention and Control are structured around four axes:

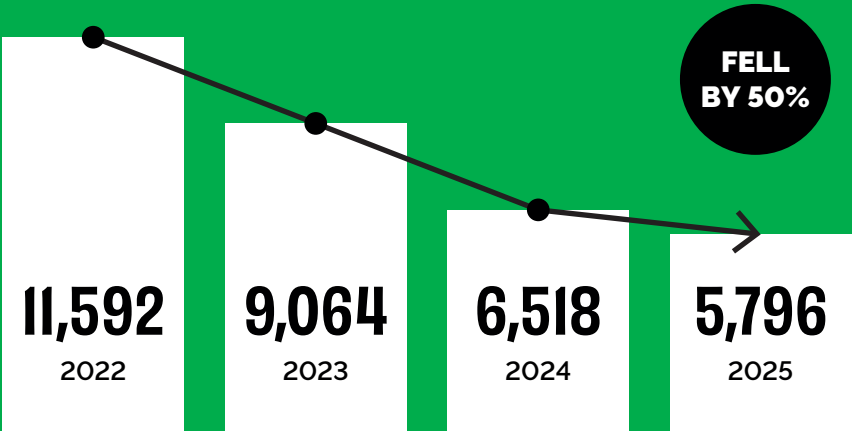
- AXIS I** • SUSTAINABLE PRODUCTIVE ACTIVITIES
- AXIS II** • ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING AND CONTROL
- AXIS III** • LAND AND TERRITORIAL PLANNING
- AXIS IV** • REGULATORY AND ECONOMIC INSTRUMENTS

The Plans have already shown concrete results:

BETWEEN 2022 AND 2024, DEFORESTATION IN THE AMAZON FELL BY 50%, AND IN THE CERRADO, BY 32%. THIS IS A CLEAR EXAMPLE THAT PRODUCTION, CONSERVATION, AND DEVELOPMENT CAN GO HAND IN HAND.

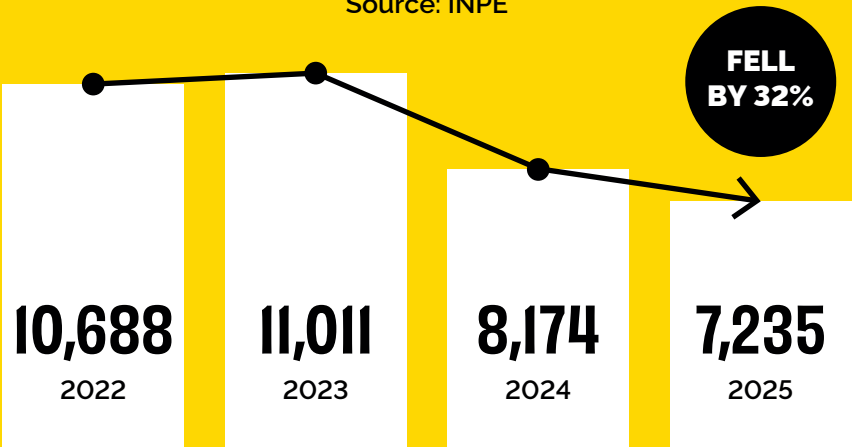
DEFORESTATION IN THE LEGAL AMAZON (Km²)

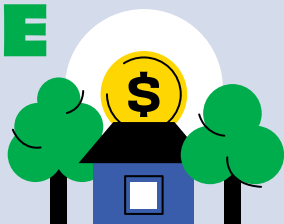

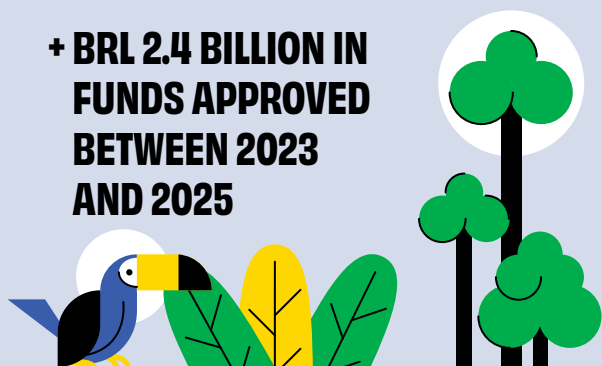

NATIONAL BIOECONOMY DEVELOPMENT PLAN (PNDBIO)

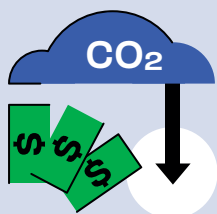


Launched at COP30 with the goal of structuring actions, targets, indicators, and resources to **promote the sustainable development of the bioeconomy in Brazil.**

AUTHORIZATION FOR VEGETATION SUPPRESSION (ASV)



Criteria and minimum conditions established for issuing ASV on rural properties, aiming to **standardize the process and increase transparency and data integration.**



BRAZILIAN EMISSIONS TRADING SYSTEM (SBCE)

The SBCE law was enacted, **establishing a regulated carbon market in the country.**

FLORESTA+ AMAZÔNIA PROJECT

allocated to forest conservation, with direct benefits for forest peoples and family farmers.



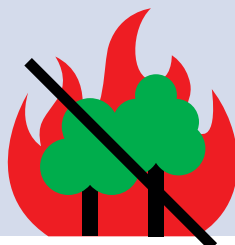
