




Ratio between the incomes of the richest 10% and the poorest capita (in R\$ 2022) 40%





#### **Unemployment rate (annual** average)





#### Annual deforestation in the Amazon biome (in km²)









#### Unemployment rate (annual average)



In the case of the layer management of the PPA (deliveries and measures institutions), the process of incorporating social participation remains in progress.

This process also foresees the marking of social participation in the attributes of the PPA, which will occur afterwards, as well monitoring thereof.
